

Digital Product Pasport (DPP)



INTRODUCTION

The DPP is a digital document that records a product's sustainability and circularity information from its design phase to its end-of-life, including:

- Origin
- Composition
- Environmental impact
- Repair options
- Recyclability of different components

REQUIREMENTS

- All products sold in the EU market (manufactured and imported) will be subject to this requirement (excluding food and medicinal products).
- The passport must be connected through a data carrier (QR code,...) located on the product, its packaging, or in the accompanying product documentation.
- The information should include references to the product's **model**, **lot**, **or item**.
